What is faith community nursing?

Faith community nursing is a professional nursing practice focusing on intentional care of the spirit, whole-person health promotion, and disease prevention.

Faith community nurses are experienced, licensed RNs who have completed specialized nursing education. They:

- Assess health needs of faith community members
- Provide health education to individuals and groups
- Make home and hospital visits
- Advocate for those who need help accessing resources
- Strengthen the spiritual health of those going through crises
- And much more

How FCNN serves faith community nurses

FCNN bridges faith and health by providing programs, networking opportunities, and professional and community resources to FCNs to improve the outcomes of their nursing care.

Our Impact

Faith Community Nurses have proven effective in health promotion interventions and make a difference in their communities:

FCNN serves over **400 nurses** practicing in faith communities, senior living, and community organizations.

FCNs spend **65% of their time** serving older adults and have proven effective in fostering community, addressing social isolation, and promoting spiritual and emotional health.

FCNs donate **thousands of hours** of professional nursing skills each year whether they are in paid or unpaid positions.

Their generosity improves the physical, emotional and spiritual health of their communities.

Ongoing research demonstrates that FCNs **save millions of health care dollars** each year by helping clients reduce their risks of strokes, heart attacks, high blood pressure, diabetes, falls and hospital re-admissions.
